

**Cinzia Milito, Biosketch**  
**M.D., Ph.D.**

Dr Cinzia Milito graduated in Medicine and Surgery in 2001, completed her specialization in Allergology and Clinical Immunology in 2006 and achieved her Ph.D. in Clinical Immunology in 2012 at “Sapienza” University of Rome.

Her research areas of interests include Primary Immunodeficiencies with particular focus on Primary Antibody Deficiencies: natural history, clinical outcome, immunoglobulin therapy and immunization. In the last years, as a Clinical Researcher at Primary Immunodeficiency Unit, “Sapienza” University of Rome, she addressed her research on non-infectious clinical complications of CVID, mainly ILD and GLILD and she joined the e-GLILD net (coordinated by Professor John Hurst and Professor Klaus Warnatz) to gain a deep knowledge of this severe PAD comorbidity and recently she was involved in the ESID ENR-Rita GLILD guidelines.

During her career she developed experience in conducting clinical trials. She participated to multicentric Italian and international trials as co-principal investigator including trials founded by the European Commission and by Italian Medicines Agency.

Regarding trials founded by Italian Medicines Agency, she was involved in the Italian multi-center study evaluating the efficacy and safety of azithromycin for the long-term prophylactic in patients with primary antibody deficiencies. In the last few years, she participated to clinical studies on COVID-19 in PAD.

She received funding from “Sapienza” University of Rome for her research on GLILD diagnosis in Primary Antibody Deficiencies.

Since its establishment, she contributed to implementation and improvement of the Italian Registry for CVID within the Italian Primary Immunodeficiency Network (IPINet) and have actively participated in the ESID registry.

In 2019, she had a visitor position in Erasmus University Medical Center in Rotterdam (Netherlands), where she conducted research activities with Professor Martin Van Hagen’s group in patients affected by CVID.

Since 2018, she has been Assistant Professor of Clinical Immunology and Internal Medicine at School of Medicine and Surgery “Sapienza”, University of Rome and, starting from 2022, she is the Deputy Director of the School of Specialty in Allergy and Clinical Immunology, “Sapienza”, University of Rome.

She has authored scientific articles published in peer-reviewed international journals.

She is a member of scientific groups and societies: ESID, Italian Working Group on Immunodeficiencies (IPINET), SIAAIC (Italian Society of Allergy, Asthma and Clinical Immunology) membership and Board member of Interest Group for Primary Immunodeficiency, ImmunITA (Italian Immunodeficiencies Association).
