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EVENT SUMMARY

This school is oriented towards professionals in the need of expanding their knowledge on Primary Immunodeficiencies for their daily work, due to the absence of reference centers for PIDs in their surroundings. The school is also a great opportunity for networking and socializing with colleagues from other countries - the ESID PIDCD School 2024, which took place in Zagreb, between the 12th and the 17th of December - counted with 20 participants and 6 Faculty members from 15 different countries!

MEETS THE NEED FOR HIGH-QUALITY EDUCATION IN PIDs

Over 6 million people worldwide suffer from PIDs, with 70 to 90% of them going untreated. The ever-increasing spectrum of manifestations means PIDs can be challenging to diagnose. It is therefore critical that doctors are supported to better screen, diagnose and treat their PID patients.
